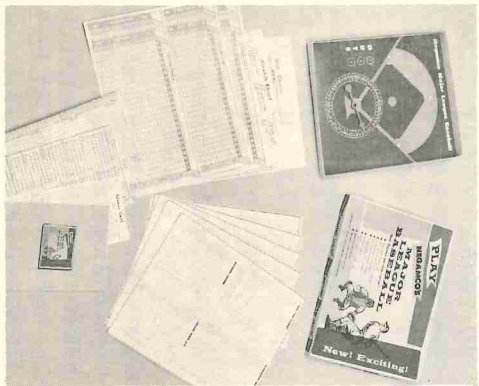

They do not rate players for play with games, but they do add excitement, and can be very useful as a visual representation of the player. This is most useful with Pennant Race. Also by adding Negamco's rating to the top or bottom front margin or to the reverse you can have most of the players rated in Negamco on cards; more beautiful, and more colorful cards than any game can provide. Unfortunately, these cards are not available all at one time, because the cards are issued by series, and each series comes out about two to four weeks apart.

TOURNAMENTS

I am pleased to see that you are planning to carry all teams from the "major tourneys". The NCAA University, and the NIT tournaments. Since the NCAA college Division (Small College) tournament and the NATA tournament have grown in prominence, I hope you will plan to carry no less than the four finalists of the NATA, and the eight-quarter-finalists of the College Division. I have enclosed lists of both events.

POLLS

Most of the teams listed in the Associated Press and United Press International will be carried by your company as a result of these clubs being engaged in tournaments. Any teams which didn't make tournaments should be included.

CONFERENCES

Last year you carried the complete Big Ten Conference, the Missouri Valley Conference and the Atlantic Coast Conference. This was an excellent decision, one in which you were backed up this past fall by a story published by the Associated Press. A college professor had used a computer to discover which college basketball conferences and leagues played the toughest schedules year after year. He went through several seasons and included hundreds of teams. The Missouri Valley teams were adjudged to play the hardest schedule annually. The Atlantic Coast Conference was second. Unfortunately other conferences and leagues weren't ranked in the story.

I feel these three ought to be carried in their entirety again.

Also, every major college conference ought to have its No. 1 and No. 2 teams represented. This way the fan could replay the games between the two top teams and also compare these two top teams from his conference with other teams in the nation.

INDEPENDENTS

The tournaments and polls will include many of the top independent teams.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Each selection should always include the highest scoring team, the best defensive team, the team with the scoring leader, the team with the rebound leader, and teams featuring the All-Americans.

A SUGGESTION

There are many fans, who would like to have all the college basketball teams of the conferences within the region. For instance, I would like to have all of the teams of the Southeastern Conference and the Southern Conference, since many of these schools play the Atlantic Coast Conference teams during the year.

I wonder if facts on these teams couldn't be gathered and made available on mimeograph sheets. We would purchase this information and transfer it to player cards. This would save you production time and cost and enable you to cover all conferences.

I'm looking forward to being able to play more college teams this year.

Because I have enjoyed my College Basketball unit#1 from this year so much, and because I feel there were so many bad mistakes in team selection last year, I have compiled for your use if you so choose a six unit, 70 team lineup for your game based on the 1966-67 NCAA season. This lineup is stronger in two ways as compared to last year's one. There are five conferences fully represented. Last year you had only three and one of these(Missouri Valley) was split between two units. All teams entered in this year's NCAA and NIT tournaments are included. Last year three of the NIT teams were somehow left out. These two important features(complete conferences plus all NCAA & NIT Teams) set 69 of the 70 places. I have suggested using the 70th place to include the NCAA College Division Champion (Kentucky Wesleyan won last year and is this years favorite.)

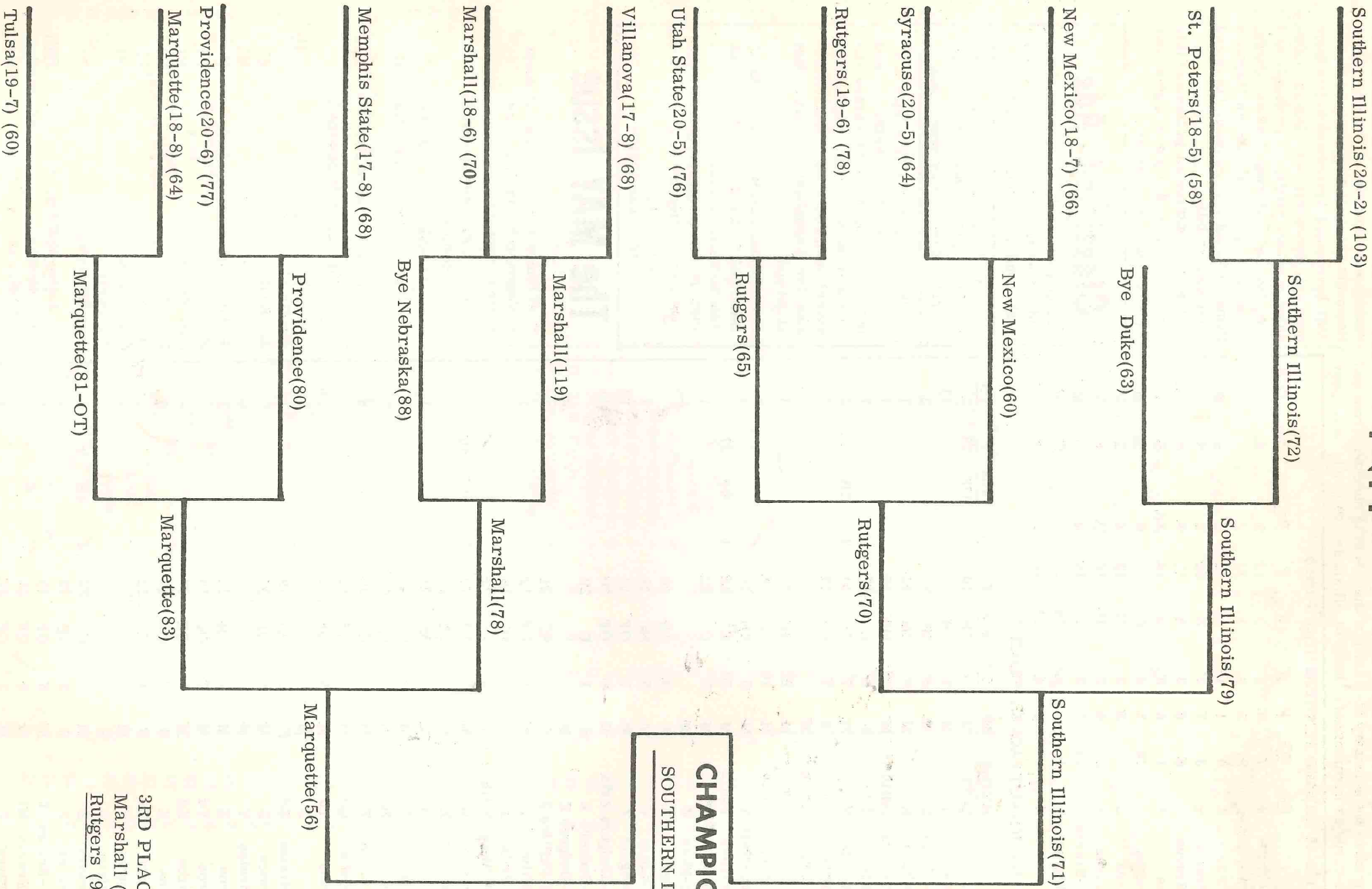
