Some BLM Football Explanations

(From BLM's Research-Dir.)

1. Defensive men are omitted because game is based on team defensive records. In order to include players who really fixed--other defen-sivemen had to be dropped. Their value is still incorporated in overall team defense.
2. Defensive stars only used as a method of using team defensive ability. Does not reflect individual strength.
3. Some teams do not have accurate lineups for us throughout the season. If injuries occur we are not always notified.
4. Ace ratings based on team defense for

run and pass(see 2 above).

5. QB's running is based on A-B division plus fumble rating. Also they are easier to defense having only one running play--Roll-Out 18. Their rating is further complicated by # of carries and times dropped passing. Some teams don't keep accurate records on this. You should use them as they were really used not solely by the rating given them. If you run them too much they will either fumble too much or they will be injured and you'll have no passer. The ratings balance each other as to the over-use if you use players improperly going only by one rating such as run rate. You may win one game this way but may lose more later on.

Roster sheet not necessary as if you overuse a player, his team will lose out in long schedule (see above 5).

ASD's Ten-Team Variable Schedule

(From ASD)

I have found great enjoyment in using your Ten Team Variable Schedule. It is great for all kinds of table sports games using a ten team league. But, I found one small error. The # 1 team is home for only eight games instead of 9 to make a total of 18 game schedule to be broad-ened as desired. I figured out that the team # 1 didn't play was number 7. I think where it most aptly belongs is under #15 running horizontally. This is because all the visitors games running vertically from 11-20 have five numbers.

Football Games

It appears that new football games are popping out all over. I have not seen any of the new ones, but I did glance at a 1967 edition of Research Game Inc.'s Pro Football. If this year's crop is anything like it--save your money! I bought it from Alan Truex of Llano, Texas. By being able to sell to me, he halved his loss--you might not be so lucky!!

I don't know who owns all the new football game companies. They, like most mail-order companies are pretty anonymous. This is perfectly okay in most instances, because they can not afford to spend money writing lengthy histories of their games and companies. Sometimes in mail-order advertising, as in other kinds of selling, you run into companies who use anonymity to deliberately disguise their product. For instance, in all of Research Game Inc's ads, you never were told what you would receive. No descriptive material, or illustrative pictures, nor even a listing of contents was included in any of their ads. This year it appears Research is not advertising, but they are. The name is "Fran Tarkenton's Pro Football." The company name depending on what you are reading is Sports Games or Pro Football. You are told Fran Tarkenton invented the game. That's possible, but I doubt it. More likely, than not, it is

an ad gimmick using Fran's popularity to sell games. If it is simply a re-packaged, re-revised edition of Research's football game it is not worth the \$7.95 you are asked to pay.

Most of these companies are doing a very good job of copying. BLM in 1957 introduced most of the ideas that all pro football games now use to impress possible customers. In 1964, BLM brought out an entirely new football game, and now it appears that the copiers have tried again. I don't know if these new games are better, but I do know that in the past the Johnny-come-latelies have failed to match BLM in baseball or basketball--it is not likely that they have succeeded in football!!!

BLM Braves' Replay

I have just completed the 1967 replay of the BLM Atlanta Braves. Their record was 78-84 in my replay. In actuality it was 77-85. While the real Braves had a good start but a poor finish, the BLM edition of the Braves won 34 of their last 58 games for a quick finish. Offensive standouts were Hank Aaron with 39 HR's and Joe Torre with 25. Although Aaron's BA and RBI's were down slightly, surprise clutch performances by Mike de la Hoz, Dennis Menke, and Tito Francona took up the slack.

Several surprise performances by the pitchers also helped Atlanta's comeback bid. Dick Kelly had an ERA of 6.45 when he reeled off almost 50 innings of great pitching and gave up only one earned run. He finished with an ERA of 3.81. Pat Jarvis had a 2-9 record and a 5.20 ERA record at the all-star break, but came back to end the season with an 11-15 chart and a 3.67 ERA. Denny Lemaster got off to one of the best starts ever. Through his first nine games he had a won-lost record of 7-2, nine consecutive complete games, two shutouts, and a 13-9 record and a 2.75 ERA.

As you probably noticed when glancing at the records, the starting pitchers were used in too many innings while the relief pitchers were used in too few. This is because I have a bad habit of keeping my starters in longer than I probably should. This has caused me to lose several games when the pitcher's SPC soared. Also the better hitters had too many at-bats although they were used in approximately the same number of games as last year.

By the way, I will be replaying the Braves next year and will get line-ups out of my back issues of The Sporting News as you have suggested in the June ASD. Then I will send you statistics and we will see just how close I can get to their actual performances.
