Drawing from our most recent conversation, you will find enclosed the most complete team-by-team lineup for the 10 National Hockey League clubs that I could muster(Ed- ASD was able to add St Louis to Harry's ten teams).

The line assignments are based on club records and are the ones used most frequently during the course of the 1968-1969 NHL schedule.

In some instances, I have included players that may not be represented in this years PTG game. Therefore, I have tried to be compromising with certain players on the West Division clubs.

I do hope that this list will aid you and those who play Neganco Hockey as well as PTG Hockey."

This information should be used as a guide to the realistic play of table game hockey. It is imperative that you play the men in the manner they played in real life if you wish to reproduce life-like results.

Hockey is a 14 to 17 man game per team. Even if you play just for fun and not to check statistical results, you should utilize all three of each clubs "lines" and their goalies properly. This information should give you a very good start in that direction.

The BOOK CORNER

Waterloo: Day of Battle by David Howarth; 223 ppg, 13 color ill., 63 black & white ill., 8 maps; hardcover; published by Atheneum, New York, 1968

If you are a battle buff who is not satisfied with just knowing the tactics and strategy of the battle this book is for you. Howarth writes the book from the viewpoint of the soldier in the field: what went on around him, and how he felt about it. Recollections of soldiers on both sides are used as the basis for the book.

You relive the day of June 18, 1815 from dawn to dusk; the full gamit of human experience - knowing the hunger, discomfort, elation and sorrow of the common soldier to that of Napoleon with his mysterious ailment.

You will better understand the shock of battle and when the day is over and the book finished you will feel the impact of knowing that 40,000 men and 10,000 horses were killed or wounded on that fateful day.

The book contains 13 pages of illustrations in full color, 63 illustrations in black and white, and 8 maps. With these maps and illustrations you can follow the progress of the French and Allies as mass groups and also as individuals.

Also included is a commentary on the primitive medical facilities that were available to the wounded soldier. It is an amazement how far medicine has come in the one hundred and fifty years or more since the battle.

By using the recollections and piecing them together David Howarth has obtained a patchwork which gives us a full picture of the day, how the battle was won, and how the people felt as it was being won and lost!
