The major drawback of SOM baseball is quite obvious-- it is the lack of strategy on plays such as the sacrifice. Yes, SOM does provide a sacrifice chart, but it does not matter whether it is Maury Wills, Harmon Killebrew, or Dean Chance at the plate.

With the chart I am presenting, it will matter if you have a man up there who can put the bat on the ball. And if you leave Bob Johnson up to bunt in a clutch situation, you may find yourself regretting it for not bringing up Vic Davalillo or Rene Stennett. And it is not only pitchers who are individualized on this chart. Frank Howard may be one of the games top power hitters, but if it's a sacrifice situation, Frank definitely is not your man.

The chart has a lot of parts but it is really not at all complicated. Just take it part by part and you'll have no problem at all.

It is most gratifying to see so many hockey mail leagues operating with a minimum of difficulty this season. I think that with maturity comes success and this sentiment has been supported by two hockey draft leagues in particular. They are the WHC, run by Joe Gross of Arlington Mass., and the Continental Hockey Association 2, directed by this writer.

## WHC

The WHC is in its second year of operation and has a 10-team, 2 division set-up. Unlike other leagues, only the top 3 teams in each division may qualify for the championship play-off series, which creates a bit of a panic for a fourth place team 10 points out of third with 7 games to go. Another innovation in the WHC is the FIGHT CHART. This form rates all players in the league on a scale of 5-1, and, with the match-ups a rating

HOW TO USE THE S-O-M SACRIFICE CHART:  
The first step is to determine the batter's sacrifice rating. Find his batting average rating and his speed rating. Then by combining these two on the chart supplied, you will find the batter's sac rating. Then, for the mechanics, two dice are tossed, a red die as the first digit and a white die as the second digit (a la APBA). This number is checked under the column on the sac chart which was found to be the batter's sac rating. The result is checked on the legend supplied.  
Note that when "A" (groundball, 7b X) or "B" (groundball, 1b X) result on the sac chart, you do not use the SOM fielding chart, but rather the chart supplied here.  
Also note the batting averages for the pitchers' hitting cards: 1 - .125; 2 - .161; 3 - .192; 4 - .233.

column activated by dice-rolls describe the fistic action. The better fighters(5,4) will have a clear advantage against the low rated players(3,2,1) but these B-type players do have a chance. In one column, the B-type fighter "B pulls A's jersey over his head and whales him for the KO." Also, it is possible to have a massive brouhaha with bench's em-tying or 1 player(if he is rated high enough) playing the avenging angel and taking on all on-ice players. The WHC also has a system of waivers and free agents that permit teams to cut and pick up(known as wheeling and dealing) skaters that may help them in their quest for a play-off berth.

## CHA 2

On the other hand, the CHA 2 is a 12-team, double division layout with the usual 4 teams being able to qualify for the play-offs. However, since this is the first year of this draft league, coaches were given NHL team names and those teams respective goalies so that the playing times of the goalers would be more in line with their real-life statistics. The CHA also offers a rate for face-off men (as does the WHC) in which players such as Mikita, Sanderson, Stenkowski will win about 70% of the draws they encounter. Too, the CHA boasts a unique penalty-assist finder system which fingers the men most responsible for assisting on goals and those indicted for infractions. Players are rated in four penalty categories: minors, double minors(with opponent), 5 minute majors(with opponent) and 10-minute misconducts. So far(after 24 games for all teams) the PTG penalty formula(that wonderful number 36) has been responsible for Rick Ley's 133 minutes, while Irvine, D. Hextall and Magnuson vie for the all-baddie team. Esposito leads with 24 goals in 24 games, while Orr has 14 goals and 47 assists.

# World Of Games

## Club Notes

(Ed) The following owners wish to contact other sport game enthusiasts in their area for the purpose of starting a game club. Write them if interested.

### BLM AND NEGAMCO BASEBALL

BLM and Negamco Baseball coaches are in for a slight surprise this year. Negamco has returned to its early publishing of its baseball rosters (which it has not been able to do in the past few years). Early birds will have already received their 1972 rosters by the time you are reading this. Negamco's new rosters are printed and made up in a 24 page booklet this year. This gives the coach the 25 man ratings plus space to put in all of the extra ratings ASD will be printing this year. Item No NB72. Price is \$3.00 plus postage, insurance, and handling on a six ounce package.

BLM's cards for '72 will be out a whole month earlier than last year's and 15 days earlier than any other year ever. BLM hopes to begin mailing bB72, bB72A, bB72N about 2/15/72. Again as last year there will be 600 cards in the complete 24 team set (25 per team). Price, weight, postage, insurance, and handling is the same as last year's set. Use any available order coupon.

BLM will allow ASD to print all extras. These will be published starting in the March 1972 issue.

I have always suggested getting your baseball rosters or cards early, so that you can set up your schedule, re-familiarize yourself with all rules and play some "spring training" games before starting on your official schedule. This year Negamco and BLM appear to be aiding this idea with their earlier releases of ratings.

### STATISTICS

Some readers have suggested that all statistics in ASD be eliminated including the baseball rosters. I agree to some extent. For instance, the NHL schedules and NHL stats will be dropped. Why? It appears for the price of a postcard and the time it takes to fill it out the NHL office is willing to furnish this free to all. Therefore, I will just tell in ASD each year how to get this free NHL booklet. Another area is FG Analysis. This will be eliminated too. The Official Football Guides are available early enough to aid the football gamer who wants all this precise football information. They are valuable books to collect.

In other areas, NBA, ABA, Baseball, material will continue to be printed as in the past. The readers who would like to see this material discontinued usually cite the fact that it can be purchased elsewhere. 1) I doubt that about the baseball rosters. 2) It is not convenient for all ASD readers. 3) It is not economically sound for all ASD readers. 4) If all sport papers deleted material because it can be found elsewhere—there would be a lot of vacant space or very few sport publications.

The criteria that ASD must follow is 1) is it valuable to gamers; 2) is it a proper function of ASD; 3) weigh it for 1 & 2 plus availability, timeliness, and space.

### READERS SUGGESTIONS

Many readers sent in input 1 from August's issue. Suggestions made, and results of input will affect the make-up of ASD. Because of the shortness of time—having to think about all the suggestions, weighing them against each other, and having to put ASD out on a faster schedule to make ASD's printing schedule right, not many recent suggestions have been used. Time is the tell-all. Circulation is a necessity. If ASD can improve in both areas, more time, more circulation—ASD should become a bigger, better, and more valuable tool for the gamer.

One of the problems I run into with suggestions is weighing them. If in haste, I make a change based on one person's opinion. I might find I have lost 100 silent readers. Most people base opinions on their personal requirements, rather than on an overall view of all readers' requirements. Often a person will ask for something to be cut out only because the reader does not care about that item. All Sports Digest must cover all games adequately. It can not afford to lose a subscriber because it does not do an adequate job in the area of gaming that reader enjoys. Suggestions should take this fact into consideration—ASD must be broadly based appealing to people of varying gaming interests. Ideas on how to cover all this ground are always welcome!

### ASD'S BASEBALL ROSTERS

In December's 1971 issue, I began again to publish the complete rosters for the preceding year's baseball season. These rosters (six teams per issue) continue in this issue and will follow in the February and March issues.

These are complete rosters. They list every man who played on every team in the major leagues last year. All vital information is given, especially that information which is of most interest to baseball table gamers.

These rosters should be very useful to Negamco and BLM baseball coaches. With these rosters the names of the players can be quickly, easily, and without error placed on the Negamco rosters or the BLM player cards. As mentioned in ASD's last issue, with these ASD rosters a coach can fill in the names in about 4 minutes per team. These baseball rosters will always be printed each year.

## Timing—Negamco Basketball

I just received my November ASD. I was at the special timing numbers for PTG and I was wondering why don't you put some out for Negamco Basketball. The last time I heard for college basketball you use 80 points per half. I was getting disgusted because most teams like Denver Unit No 11 would hardly get the rebound against some powerhouses like Western Kentucky, Jacksonville, etc. Most scores would be about 75-67. Now I play like PTG used to play 86 shots per half. I am getting better scores and the tough teams are getting higher scores and the mediocre are getting about their average. In one game, Jacksonville scored 75 pts against Loyola of New Orleans under the 80 pt rule Jacksonville averaged last year 99.9 per game so I played the game over under the 86 shot rule and Jacksonville won again but by the score of 105 to 93 about average for both teams.

(Ed) The one weakness in Negamco's basketball service is their failure to up-date the timing rule each year. Of course with the tremendous variation in college no single rule can cover the timing of all games.

The 1972 edition of NBA should be: 224 total—56, 112, 168, 224 quarter totals.

I prefer use of random number booklets, calling offensive signals for both teams, random selection of defenses based on a pre-game plan giving 1 to 50 percentages on the occurrence of defenses and keys and use of the optional defensive adjustment chart. You will find that BLM Football is a precise coaches game that prods the thoughtful coach to developing good understanding of all players and combinations of player personnel. I do not think you can help but "score" when you buy BLM.

Basketball cards are re-rated for all basketball games every year. Watch for each company's announcement. PTG, BLM, and Negamco make their yearly announcements in the Big League Game Company's quarterly co-op circulars. You should read these carefully for up-to-date information on rated cards.

I also use intentional fouls by simply fouling a man when he has the ball with the man that is opposite him.

Dice Rules

Each game comes with instructions for the two games included. Here are instructions for various table games.

If a game uses just one die(nos 1 thru 6) then roll the electro-dice one time and read just the lefthand display.

If game uses two dies(nos 1 thru 12) then roll the electro-dice one time and read both displays.

If a game uses three dies use the first two rules in combination. Such as in Stratomatic Baseball. The first roll would be to get the one die roll(nos 1 thru 6). The second roll would be to get the two die total(nos 1 thru 12).

The value of the electro dice is that you get a fast, true roll each time. With regular dice you always have to worry about a poor surface, the dies rolling and getting lost, cooked dice, and possible errors in manufacture that would favor one number on a die over the other five numbers.
