Fan Devises Own Schedule

Enclosed is my version of a college football schedule for the 1970 season using the 25 teams available through BLM & ASD. I have also added a 26th team, North Carolina, the Peach Bowl opponent of Arizona State.

The schedule calls for 140 games & is similar in construction to the one by Vann Brown (?) about 2 years ago.

The teams are divided into six groups: Pacific 8, Big 8, Big 10, Southeast, Southwest, & Independents.

All games actually played between the 26 teams (29, if you include Texas Tech, Army, & Navy) are scheduled first. Next are the games needed to complete a round robin series within each group. Finally, intersectional games are selected to complete each team's schedule.

To obtain a balanced schedule, I ranked the teams from 1 to 26 & deliberately selected the intersectional games to achieve the following results:

1. The top 11 teams averaged 5.5 games against other top 11's & 5.5 games against the "other 15" teams.

2. The "other 15" teams averaged 4.0 games against the top 11 teams & 6.5 games among themselves.

I also tried to maintain the correct dates for the games that were actually played; but, some games were played on Sept. 12 or Dec. 5 & had to be changed.

All home games & bowl games are capitalized. (I added a Michigan-Arkansas bowl game, since both teams just missed being their conference champion.)

I have really enjoyed the changes in ASD over the last 2 years. Tell your correspondents to keep up the good work! Also, cutting down on major sport stats & schedules to make room for PTG basketball & hockey teams was definitely a major step in improving ASD.

QUESTIONS ON PASS PLAYS

I am a proud owner of Negamco Football, Basketball, Boxing, Golf, and Hockey and would like to commend the Negamco Company for such fine games.

However, there is one question I have about Negamco Football. I do not know if you have received letters on this topic before, but it is an important one. I have found the "Hook Pass" to be far too easy to complete, for a play with such gained yardage. In an experiment, I played one quarter of a game using just Hook Passes. Out of all the passes thrown that quarter only one was incomplete. I know that the Screen Pass and Flare Pass is also easily completed, but it is not such a sure yardage as the Hook. A screen pass or, Flare Pass may lose yardage while the shortest distance a hook goes is 5 yards. I have repeatedly experimented, getting almost identical results each time. A "Break Out Short" Pass Play is good for about the same yardage as a hook but far harder (and more realistically, I think) to complete. My question is: Is it all right to change some numbers on the completion chart for the Hook Pass? If so could you help me as to which numbers? I think that this change would make the game extremely more realistic and fun even though it is both of these already.

One other note-I don't know whether you remember but my brother was once rated in your 1966-67 season, FG-1-47, FT-1-70, PE-42-51, RB-2. BC-11-66. (My brother's card, Jim Valvano) I only hope I can achieve the greatness of which it takes to be rated in your games-in college and the Pros.

Ps. If you wonder what my brother is now doing he has just completed coaching Johns Hopkins University to its first winning season in over 2 decades, in Basketball. He is now head Freshman coach and Asst. Varsity coach, for Basketball, at the University of Connecticut. Best of luck with your fine paper, ASD, and one last note for all that don't believe Negamco is realistic. My Negamco game average came within .5 of a point of my brother's real college average.

Once again, continue your fine work on table top sports games.

(Ed) You can change some completions by using the NG numbers if you want to.

Actually you should not throw any pass more than once in a 4 play sequence. Possibly you should only throw hook pass once every 6 plays at the very most. In real-life a team would look for the play and stop it if you over-used it.

Realistic Mechanics

I would just like to say how much I enjoy your Baseball and Football games. I am constantly amazed how these two games seem to contain as much strategy, player individualism, and realistic mechanics as the most expensive game products. In the past few years I have purchased many of the cheaper (under \$10) sports games which other companies offer. However, I was invariably disappointed with all of them. You are to be heartily congratulated for manufacturing two excellent sports games.

After these words of praise, I would like to offer a bit of constructive criticism (not concerning your games, but the way you sell your games). I do wish that you would dispense with the use of a complicated postage chart. I sincerely believe that you may be losing a number of sales because of it. Why not include postage in the price of the game itself? For example, rather than sell for \$4.89 plus postage, plus insurance, and handling, why not sell your Baseball game for a flat \$6.75 or \$7.00? This way, a newcomer would see how easy it is to order a game by mail, and would not be scared off by a needless series of computations. Besides this, I'm sure that many of your customers are quite young and make all kinds of errors figuring out the total of their orders. This in turn is frustrating for you, in that customers may forget to add in postage and handling. Isn't this a fair argument?

Whether or not I've persuaded you to take a second look at your ordering policy, I can assure you that I will continue to support your company by purchasing your products.

Playing Tips

PTG Basketball Correction

I. The following No.'s on playing board do not count as time played or as a shot attempted for player.

- No. 6,
- No. 8, Defender B
- No. 8, Defender C or D
- No. 10, Defender C or D
- No. 46 — counts as time played or same as one attempted shot.

II. Fringe players are given a whole number plus a decimal number for their S number. Some are 3.3; 3.4; 3.6; for example. They would fall then between players as follows — If your five men were S1, S3, S3.4, S5, S9 you would put them in that order and their corresponding number on team shot card would be S1=S1; S3=S2; S3.4=S3; S5=S4; S9=S5.

The fringe player assist numbers are given on player card. If they conflict with a regular player who is in the game — give assist to both players.

III. When more than one player has been assigned the same assist number on Team assist chart and both are playing give both men an assist. You will get right amount of assists this way even though most scorers only give one assist on a scoring play. Sometimes they give none.

IV. The change Def. III to 29 was a misprint. This change should be ignored. It has been corrected in entering numbers on individual playing cards so you will get better data.

BLM FOOTBALL RULE CHANGES AND INTERPRETATIONS

1. All position symbols as follows are to be used in this manner.
 - A. SE or FL - can play either position
 - B. FB or HB - can play either position
 - C. RB - can play either HB or FB
2. When SE, FL, or TE are given a Run rating you can call them on a run play not to exceed one per half. Use the QB18 Rollout play as the play indicator.
3. The Fumble Recovery Run play in the rules is to be deleted as there are no official statistics on which to run this play. The Lateral play in rules under K. is deleted also for the same reason.

INJURY TABLE FOR

NEGAMCO BASKETBALL

When a Number 90 is spun, offensive player is injured. Spin again and refer to the following chart to determine injury.

- 1-24 Out rest of quarter
- 25-54 Out rest of half (If injury occurs in second quarter, player is out only for the duration of the half. "Out rest of half" does not mean "Out for two quarters." At least, not necessarily.
- 55-82 Out rest of game
- 83-89 Out rest of game plus 1 game
- 90-95 Out rest of game plus 2 games
- 96-98 Out rest of game plus 3 games
- 99-100 Out rest of season (Optional. Otherwise, out rest of game plus four games.

designated as to position, and the superior fielding plays bit (automatic outs) is dubious (logically, I guess it's allright, but....).

The game plays much along the lines of Be A Manager (nothing like BLM); which, by the way, I once devised my own complex rating system for—but when my ratings did not agree with theirs I read further and saw their ratings were not the previous season but a projection of the next - I put both the game and my system in a corner.

With the advent of Extra Innings last fall I found myself in correspondence with the original, Jack Kavanaugh. I supplied him with ratings of teams which appeared in (and gained my a complimentary copy of) his "second edition". The play of the game is simple and in all it is probably fairly accurate, But, Mr. Kavanaugh has found himself in charitable employ (he is director of a school for retarded children, or closely akin to that) and for this his game will probably suffer. Which brings me to one point - I have rated (as best I could) the 5-year National Association (1971-5) for this game. I do not believe that with the available statistics this could be done with any other game. I had to rate pitchers by their won-lost record and extra-base hitting as a team rate derived from the runs scored-to-hits ratio; but all-in-all, it should work out fairly well. If you should like any of these ratings for possible printing let me know and I will type them up (that might take a while!)

Also after reading The Universal Baseball Association...I became intrigued with the idea and have begun making up what I felt the game would be like. Thus far I have: an Unusual Occurrences Chart, a Special Stress Chart, a Sacrifice Chart, a Steal Chart, 2 Aging Charts, one injury chart, a Hit-and-Run and Infield-in modification chart. 6-24 man rosters (I intend cut down to from 17 to 20 men), and figures are ready to get on to the 9 major charts. I based my calculations on a modification of the 1970 season (a little more hitting for the basics and on 80 game-6 team schedule for the Unusual Occurrences Chart. If this game is of interest I could also send it when finished, although I am not sure of the copyrights (or whatever) which might exist on the idea of the game from the ASD.

I enjoy ASD very much. The Negamco pitcher's PHR ratings add a bit of realism that was lacking. Why not a PBB rating for batters to alter the pitcher's W factor?

Also Peter Hirt's comments on Strat-o-matic add to an already great periodical. Might I ask you to pass on to him a suggestion. When he rates players, as he has done, why not use cards from the Old-Timer teams? It gives him a greater base to draw upon and it is more probable that a fan will have (or be able to obtain) a card from the 1946 Red Sox, than one from the 1969 Padres. Also when he designates that a.250 or .260 "Nameless

Player" card be used he designates which by the walk frequency (G.P. or A for good, poor, or average). Also he could use the pitchers from the nameless player set and designate them by the four projected ratings on their card (ignoring the average in good - average and average - poor), which would be GPGG, GGGP, PAPP, AGAP, VAPA, VPVP, AGAA, and GAAP.

Also, for one player Mr. Hirt mentioned that he had altered one of the "Nameless Players" to fit. This opens the door to altering other cards to fit certain players. He might even be able to make up his own larger set of "Nameless Players" to draw upon for future ratings.

Game Report

EXTRA INNINGS is a new base-ball table-top game, designed to re-create not only present day players but to define the records of all the players of the past as well.

A unique rating system allows any fan to chart the offensive play of any star that ever played baseball. In this way, it is possible to play some of the great teams of the past against the current crop of today's league leaders. Since players are given the formula for player performance, there is no need to re-order cards every year. All one needs are the players statistics for the year they want and in a few minutes can see that Babe Ruth was certainly the Sultan of Swat.

The game is played with 3 die, colored red, white and green. These dice, used in combination with the playing instructions, guide the player as to the flow of action. It is important to realize that any new game has a few flaws and EXTRA INNINGS cannot escape this freshman jinx. The flow seems to be in the fielding department. Players are not rated individually but by team. This of course, affects the double-play possibility, but also does not allow too much strategy on the base paths as Frank Howard's arm is just as good as Clemente's. However, certain players are rated as Superior Defensive players and Limited Defensive Players. Certain plays directed at these men will see base hits and possible errors turned into outs by the first group, and outs turned into hits and errors by the second group.

Pitchers are rated according to their earned run average and these ratings are averaged (A-E) to give a players performance grouped (A-E) to give a players performance

against all types of pitching. A major innovation in EXTRA INNINGS is that the better hitting rate changes depending on if the pitcher is right or left-handed. Accordingly, the pitchers with lower ERA's will give up fewer hits, walks and errors, and will fan more than lower graded pitchers which is fairly accurate, although not in all cases.

But the biggest asset to EXTRA INNINGS is that you can actually rate your own players. With all this information to guide you, EXTRA INNINGS should be given a look-see by those who wish a little more in the line of rating their own cards.
