(Ed) In some issues, this column entitled "Guest Spot" will appear. It will be used for indepth commentary written by table gamers. A commentary that should be of interest to readers.

First, some thank you's: for the Negamco Frookie Ratings, though I feel the positions of the players should have been included (basketball, that is). For the PTG College Teams, for the updated Boxing ratings, for the PHR ratings for baseball, and the rosters, and many other things.

I personally would hate to see you discontinue printing the NBA and ABA stats as you did last summer, I went ahead and ordered the NBA guide anyway, but not until the current season was well under way and because it did have a lot of information I wanted. But to those of us involved in leagues whose season hadn't begun yet, and for just the general interest involved, your stats were quite timely. I hope you do continue to print them. I must disagree with Bill Hupp on this point and also on his views about the "Mail Sack". I personally find that feature of great interest. It is often the only way we have of expressing our ideas and activities in gaming.

Speaking for the interests of PTG Basketball gamers, I would like to see you print fringe players for this game as you are doing for hockey.

As for increasing your subscriptions, I think all leagues which publish newsletters should endorse ASD frequently in those newsletters and should recommend ASD to everyone who inquires into their league. I also feel that ASD should be given the same coverage in the magazine advertisements for Negamco, BLM, PTG, and ATC as it is given in the circulars we receive. This may induce more people to subscribe when they order their game from the magazine advertisement. I wish you good luck in endeavoring to increase your subscriptions and if there is any way I can be of assistance, please let me know.

As to my current gaming activities, I am involved in a draft league called American Association Basketball League. It is in its second season (I am an expansion club) and seems to be successful in spite of a few dropouts and problems. Todd Lucas is the Acting Commissioner as Mike Trautman is in the Navy. Our all-star game has just been played and the East, spurred by Lew Alcindor who had 28 points and 18 rebounds and was voted MVP of the game, won over the West 128-122. Oscar Robertson had 23 points for the West.

Unfortunately, my team is in next to last place and probably will not qualify for the playoffs, which will have the top four teams in each division. But I am looking ahead to next year. There is a waiver system, a mid-season draft for players on teams which have dropped out, and so on. A very good league.

I have just started my 2nd Annual NBA tournament, using PTG for the first time. Last year I had both NBA and ABA but did not order ABA cards this year. The defending champs, the Lakers, will play the Warriors in the first round, which will be a 2 of 3 series. In my first game, San Diego battled back in the second half to crush the Atlanta Hawks 109-93 as Elvin Hayes pumped in 10 as he scored 20 points in the third qtr to bring the

Thanks are due to many fine ASD readers. Contributions received recently have been great.

Additional editorial contributions and suggestions are always welcome. ASD's readership is increasing. We hope that our recently increased subscription prices will not affect this renewed interest in All Sports Digest.

ASD has heard comments on Rich Glover's absence from this years BLM Nebraska College football team and Alan Page's lack of an high ace rating.

Glover was missing because he did not fit into the Pro defensive alignment which is the basis for the BLM game. BLM's defensives are variations of the 4 man set. Nebraska played a 5 man front. Their defense is accurately portrayed, but either Glover or another fine Nebraska defensive lineman had to be left out or else Glover placed in at a position he did not play.

Minnesota's Defense is also accurately represented either by use of the Adj. Chart or

Rockets from behind.

I am also playing a replay of the Atlanta Hawks season, 70-71, though I may have to forego it if I find my activities are too much. However, as the league is nearing the last month and I have only a few more games to play, I will probably combine Negamco and PTG in these other activities. Since I am only working part-time, I have time for gaming. I do not consider it a childish activity at all. True, I am single but I have a college background and am currently teaching guitar part-time. These, I suppose, could be called "adult" activities. So, I believe, is serious gaming.

In baseball (Negamco), I did little last year as I did not order the rosters. Oh, I did play the All-Star game which you printed in ASD and take some pride in the fact that mine was the first result you published. And I played a "Rookie" All-Star Game based on your ratings, but that wasn't too successful. I have ordered this season's rosters.

Now to boxing. I have devised a system for those who want to keep their game up-to-date. For instance, Leotis Martin is no longer a contender. And he was not included in the Heavyweight ratings you last published. He is still active, as is Al Jones, and some other fighters. But in a few years, his ability has gone below that of current challengers like Foreman, or even Floyd Patterson. Since he probably will not make the Top 10 again, his card has no way of being updated. The boxing game has two choices. Not use the fighter at all, or try to use him realistically. It is not realistic for a fighter like Martin to fight someone like Foreman when the latter's rating is fairly well updated (thanks to ASD), but the former's is not.

My system is this: Reduce the former contender's punch result numbers by one each, except

by use of the aces. If Page were given more aces the net affect would be to increase the Vikings Defensive abilities beyond what they actually were. It appears that again and again I must explain—That BLM's giving or withholding of aces from a player doesn't reflect their judgement of that player's ability. The aces and the players given the aces are determined solely on the basis of the team's ability. Naturally, where possible the aces are given to the team's actual defensive stars, but where that makes the team's ability inaccurate it isn't done. You can, since it is your copy of the game, increase the aces given to any player, but in doing so you destroy that team's defensive realism and the opposing team's offenses.

One reader wrote recently criticizing ASD for not having game critiques in the last two years. I realize that I fall short in this area. The problem is — I set a high standard for these critiques. The writer has to be a very experienced gamer, and an expert critic. The feature had to be in-depth. Some of ASD's critiques were written by readers, many were written by me. The time it takes to meet these standards is a

where the result is 1. In this case leave it at 1 unless it is a Jab. On a Jab, blank the number, making it purely defensive punch as it is on many of the current ratings. Leave the KDs and recovery ratings as they were.

The effect of this is to reduce the boxer's chances of winning the fight, yet still give him some chance of a "Comeback".

If a former champion is involved, the gamer may want to leave the rating at its peak and use the boxer in the capacity of one of the "Famous Fighters" series.

Another thing I wanted to mention concerning a recent "Playing Tip" on Negamco Basketball. I disagree with the premise a reader based his opinion on. The higher scorers do generally draw more one shot fouls because they shoot and score more and are more closely defended. Spinning again when a player is fouled only makes the game longer and may confuse a player who gets caught up in the speed of the game. I think Negamco is very adequate in its handling of fouls.

One more thing and then I'll close. Bill Hupp also said he thought "player replays should be eliminated unless they are from the more (emphasis mine) established leagues like the UBL." Certainly I know of the UBL's reputation and they deserve much credit. But please, let's not make ASD a cliquish newspaper. Let's not be snobbish because we are in a league, however "established" it is. The individual table gamer would be lost in the shuffle. Keep the "Owners Game Replays" and the "League News" as you have done in the past. Of course, you can't print all the replays you get, but you have used good discretion in the past.

deterrent to publishing these critiques.

However, some have been published in the last two years. I do not know how ASD's reader missed the Cadaco All-Star Baseball Critique. I will try for more. I may institute a section on "Mini-Critiques". What, and where various games are available.

One subscriber questioned ASD's price increase. The price increase is not as great as it seems. Actually, the change is three fold. 1) The price was increased because the cost of printing and mailing is increasing, the number of subscriptions have decreased the last few years (even though long term subscriptions and individual issues purchased have turned up the last few months). 2) ASD hopes to expand to 16 pages - if not for every issue at least a few issues each year. Before we increase the size I must work hard to get ASD up-to-date. Because of a little backsliding, and weather related delays during August-September, ASD is still 30 days off its targeted publishing schedule. 3) ASD is reverting back to its policy of reducing initial clerical expenses on new and renewal subscription purchases by giving reduced rates to longer-term subscribers. Since eliminating this feature a few years ago, ASD has received mostly one year subscriptions. The cost in

FUMBLE RECOVERY CHART RATINGS is, OWN fumble recovered or OPPONENTS fumble recovered.

RULES FOR SIMON'S
FUMBLE RECOVERY RATINGS USE the XRB Chart for the Result

1) When fumble occurs follow usual procedure in determining who recovers the ball. If an individual player can be identified then use the following ratings.
A "O" rating means that for that particular situation there can be no runback, that is, the ball is recovered at the point of the fumble.

2) If the player is unknown, then use the team rating, for the particular situation, that rating be used.
For ratings see October 1972 issue, page 7.

3) A "blank" rating suggests that the team

Playing Tips

In playing BLM baseball I have found it difficult to use players in the same number of games that they actually played. Here are two rules I use that will cause players to be used realistically.

REST FOR PITCHERS

Use the number of games pitched for the year and the number of innings pitched in the game, along with this table to determine necessary rest.

If pitcher did not go over SPC or RPPC subtract one from needed rest, except where marked with an asterisk. Even if a starter does not need three games rest he should usually get it anyway to keep the rotation intact. Rest can be considered in terms of games or days, depending on which type of schedule you use.

INJURIES

1. During walk procedure if a 50 is spun, complete the play and then determine the details of the injury.
2. Who is injured? Spin a number. If first digit is even a member of the home team is injured, if odd it's the visiting team. Second digit indicates position, with the addition of O meaning pitcher. If the man at the indicated position is out of the game because of a pinch-hitter or runner then the substitute is injured. If the injured man was not involved in the play, consider him to have been injured on some prior play.
3. How long is he injured? Determine

I am enclosing my latest BLM Defensive Adjustments which you never have published. I have found them accurate and more reliable than your Research man's. Would you kindly include the Fringe Player list and the Defensive Adjustments for comparison.

the number of games that the player actually missed by totaling up all games played in the field and subtract from 162 (or the number of games that the team actually played if different from 162). If the player played more than one position and had no PH appearances (e.g. Pittsburgh's No. 30 Dave Cash) you must look in the statistics to find the number of games he played. For pitchers multiply starts by 4 and relief games by 2 and consider that to be his games played. Spin another number, multiply it by the number of games missed, and divide by 300 (100 for pitchers.) This is the duration of injury.

4. How bad is he injured? Divide PH games by games missed and multiply by 200. Spun number between one and this means player can pinch-hit or run until his injury is over. No injured player may field or pitch.

Working example: Suppose the Giants are playing the Pirates at Pittsburgh. The first number in pitching to Dietz is a 50. When his time at bat is through spin a number, say 16. One is odd, so it's a Giant, six is the shortstop, so it's Chris Speier. He played 156 games, so he missed six. Spin another number, say 84. $84 \times 6 \div 300 = 1.68$, which rounds off to two games (or days.) He had one PH game so $1 \div 6 \times 200 = 33$. Spun number 1-33 means he can pinch-hit or run until the two games are over, 34-100 means he cannot. Two games means two games in addition to the remainder of the game in which he is injured. Another example: suppose the first number was 44 instead of 16. Four is even, it's a Pirate, 4 means second-base so it's Dave Cash. You can't tell from the card how many games he played so look in the statistics (the Baseball Guide or similar book is an excellent source) and see that he played 123 games. So he missed 39. Spin another number, say 71. $71 \times 39 \div 300 = 9$ games. He had no PH games so skip that step. Another example: let's bust up a pitcher this time. First number is 80, rather than 44 or 16. Eight is even a Pirate, O is the pitcher, Bob Johnson. Johnson had 27 starts and four relief games. $(4 \times 27) + (2 \times 4) = 108 + 8 = 116$. $162 - 116 = 46$. Spin another number, say 54. $54 \times 46 \div 100 = 25$ games. Michael Mavrogianis, 26 Slocum Avenue, Port Washington, New York, 11050

HEADLINE HOCKEY

by Bob Collins

(Ed) The following is reprinted from the ASC News—A mail sports game club newsletter. Bob is a long-time club member, hockey buff, and subscriber to ASD.

Have you ever played Negamco Hockey? If you have you may know that you can win games by playing the right end of a choice of styles.

The Boston Bruins penalty killing unit has been known for its explosive goal scoring while they are short-handed. Negamco Hockey gives you two choices while on the power play. For one you may choose to let the other team kill the penalty by spinning the number to correspond with the opposing players PK rating leaving no chance for them to get a shot away. Secondly, you may let them play regularly with opportunities for passing, shooting and scoring. With the Bruins, this certainly means death for your team.

However, little known to most Negamco players, the game is to be played statistically more so than strategically. This means in order for a truly realistic replay, PK rating (option 1) should be used. If the coaches of the league desired a strategically oriented league, option 2 is the best. If option 1 is chosen, each club has a much better chance of catching the B's.

IT'S HOCKEY TIME

This I feel is the most important factor in winning a game. It consists of 3 sections: 1) Preview 2) Set-up, and 3) Review.

Preview—As in football, you should preview the opposing club by concentrating on its strong points and weak points. Every club has both. This is where you become a coach or a game player. You must analyze game summaries, top scorers, goaltenders, etc.

Set-Up—Make up 3, 4, or 5 lineups and find out which one is best suited for defeating the opposition. Match your best line with their best. Mix up lines until it is right. My favorite lineup system is: Line 1: Their best

In other words, use a 2-line system to gain the advantage. After you have a comfortable lead, rest your lines by adding a third, or even fourth line.

Review—If you win or if you lose, find out why, memorize it. You'll play that team again.

DEFENSIVE ADJUSTMENTS

In the last few years I've found that as expansion has been added, scoring has increased. As scoring has increased, Negamco hasn't changed their methods. Therefore we have to do it. Below is the table I have worked out. Use it to find defensive adjustments. M=Minus, P=Plus; E=Even. Subtract or add number from shooters rating.

This chart shows rating against team on top. Number indicates what to do with opposing scorer ratings.
